ORIGINAL ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

The undersigned acting as incorporator(s) of a corporation under Chapter 7-1.1 of the General Laws, 1956, as amended, adopt(s) the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation:

FIRST. The name of the corporation is IMAGES PHOTOGRAPHY, INC.

(A close corporation pursuant to \$7-1.1-51 of the General Laws, 1956, as amended) (strike if inapplicable)

Second. The period of its duration is (if perpetual, so state) perpetual

THIRD. The purpose or purposes for which the corporation is organized are:

Operation of a photography studio and any other lawful purpose

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The corporation shall have power: (See §7-1.1-4 of the General Laws, 1956, as amended.)

- (a) To have perpetual succession by its corporate name unless a limited period of duration is stated in its articles of incorporation.
 - (b) To sue and be sued, complain and defend, in its corporate name.
- (c) To have a corporate seal which may be altered at pleasure, and to use the same by causing it, or a facsimile thereof, to be impressed or affixed or in any other manner reproduced.
- (d) To purchase, take, receive, lease, or otherwise acquire, own, hold, improve, use and otherwise deal in and with, real or personal property, or any interest therein, wherever situated.
- (e) To sell, convey, mortgage, pledge, lease, exchange, transfer and otherwise dispose of all or any part of its property and assets.
 - (f) To lend money and to use its credit to assist its employees.
- (g) To purchase, take, receive, subscribe for, or otherwise acquire, own, hold, vote, use, employ, sell, mortgage, lend, pledge or otherwise dispose of, and otherwise use and deal in and with, shares or other interests in, or obligations of, other domestic or foreign corporations, associations, partnerships or individuals, or direct or indirect obligations of the United States or of any other government, state, territory, governmental district or municipality or of any instrumentality thereof.
- (h) To make contracts and guarantees and incur liabilities, borrow money at such rates of interest as the corporation may determine, issue its notes, bonds, and other obligations, and secure any of its obligations by mortgage or pledge of all or any of its property, franchises, and income.
- (i) To lend money for its corporate purposes, invest and reinvest its funds, and take and hold real and personal property as security for the payment of funds so loaned or invested.
- (j) To conduct its business, carry on its operations, and have offices and exercise the powers granted by this chapter, within or without this state.
 - (k) To elect or appoint officers and agents of the corporation, and define their duties and fix their compensation.
- (I) To make and alter by-laws, not inconsistent with its articles of incorporation or with the laws of this state, for the administration and regulation of the affairs of the corporation.
 - (m) To make donations for the public welfare or for charitable, scientific or educational purposes.
- (n) To transact any lawful business which the board of directors shall find will be in aid of governmental authority.
- (a) To pay pensions and establish pension plans, pension trusts, profit-sharing plans, stock bonus plans, stock option plans and other incentive plans for any or all of its directors, officers and employees.
- (p) To provide insurance for its benefit on the life of any of its directors, officers, or employees, or on the life of any stockholder for the purpose of acquiring at his death shares of its stock owned by such stockholder.
 - (q) To be a promoter, partner, member, associate, or manager of any partnership, enterprise or venture.
 - (r) To have and exercise all powers necessary or convenient to effect its purposes.

FIFTH. Provisions (if any) dealing with the preemptive right of shareholders pursuant to \$7-1.1-24 of the General Laws, 1956, as amended:

No stockholder shall sell or transfer by sale and exchange, gift or otherwise, any of the capital stock of this corporation unless be shall first offer it to the other stockholders of the corporation at its book value on the next preceding annual statement of this company and in determining said book value, no value shall be placed on the good will of the corporation. Upon death or where a stockholder desires to transfer or sell any of the capital stock of this company, the stockholder, his trustee, executor, administrator, or other said person or persons representing said stockholder's interest in said shares, shall send a written notice addressed to each stockholder of the corporation, of his intention to dispose of his stock in the corporation or of such right to purchase the shares hereinafter mentioned, such notice shall be sent by registered mail, return receipt requested. The stockholder shall have thirty (30) days within which to buy all or any portion of the stock offered for sale or transfer or of said deceased shareholder, whichever the case may be, and shall signify their desire to purchase the same by an acceptance in writing sent to the offering stockholder by registered mail, return receipt requested. If at the end of thirty (30) days none of the stockholders to whom the stock is offered have signified their intention to purchase said stock all or any part thereof, then the offerer shall be at liberty to make such sale or pransfer of his stock as he may deem advisable.
