R.I.G.L. 7-1.2-1501(e), states that any corporation failing or refusing to file its annual report for any year within thirty (30) days after the time prescribed by law is subject to a penalty fee of \$25.00. **Please file your Annual Report for the year 2009 along with payment in the amount of \$75.00 that includes both the annual report filing fee and required penalty fee.** The filing must be made with the Office of the Secretary of State, Corporations Division, within the next sixty (60) days to ensure your authority to conduct business will remain intact.
