TO VACATE THE FORFEITURE OR REVOCATION OF THE CHARTER OF
PROVIDENCE JEWELERS' CLUB

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The time within which Providence Jewelers' Club, incorporated March 22,
2 1977 shall file the reports for the years 1992, 1993, 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2000,
3 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009, and 2010 as required under the
4 provisions of section 7-6-90 of the general laws of Rhode Island, 1956, is hereby extended to the
5 31st day of December, A.D., 2011 if said corporation shall file in the office of the Secretary of
6 State before December 31, 2011, the reports which it should have filed in the said years and shall
7 pay to the Secretary of State the filing fees therefore, having previously thereto paid to the
8 General Treasurer for the use of the state such sum as the Attorney General shall decide should be
9 paid by said corporation as a compromise for the penalty or penalties for its failure to file such
10 reports then the forfeiture or revocation of the charter of said corporation shall thereupon, to wit,
11 upon the filing of said reports and the payment of said fees, be vacated and said corporation shall
12 thereupon be entitled to all of the privileges, benefits and powers and subject to the same duties
13 and liabilities as though no forfeiture or revocation of its said charter had taken place.

14 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect on passage

Dear Ms. Antonacci:

I have received and reviewed your letter of January 26, 2011 wherein you seek relief on behalf of the Providence Jewelers' Club from a penalty by the Secretary of State. Pursuant to R. I. Gen. Laws § 7-1-23 this office may compromise certain corporate fees for good cause but we are not allowed to waive them.

After reviewing the material you sent we find there is good cause to compromise these fees for the Providence Jewelers' Club and that the Club has taken positive steps to address these payments going forward. Moreover, we recognize that the Providence Jewelers' Club is a non-profit organization that operates for a public purpose. Based on our review and findings we hereby compromise the fees owed by the Providence Jewelers' Club to \$25, which represents a single penalty fee.
