ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

The undersigned, acting as incorporator(s) of a corporation under Chapter 7-6 of the General Laws of Rhode Island, 1956, as amended, adopt(s) the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation:

- 1. The name of the corporation is Dare to Dream
- 2. The period of its duration is (if perpetual, so state) Perpetual Duration

3. The specific purpose or purposes for which the corporation is organized are:

To empower women to pursue their God-given dreams while living a
balanced fulfilled life. This mission shall be accomplished through teaching
and life coaching. This shall include consultations that will encourage the
development of a relationship with God and the Holy Spirit. It will also help
women develop Support and Accountability networks and skills on how to
persevere against hardships and fulfill their life's dreams.

- 4. Provisions, if any, not inconsistent with the law, which the incorporators elect to set forth in these articles of incorporation for the regulation of the internal affairs of the corporation are:
- Dare to Dream shall limit its governance to avoid conflicts of interest and
any undue entanglement with for profit businesses.

Addendum to Articles of Incorporation

This organization is organized exclusively for charitable/educational/religious/scientific or other purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) Internal Revenue Code. The specific purpose of this organization is to meet the social and economic needs of all our clients.

Notwithstanding any other provisions of these activities, Dare to Dream shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by an organization exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law); or b) by an organization contributions to which are deductible under 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law).

Upon dissolution of this Corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (or any corresponding provision of any future federal tax code), or shall be distributed to the Federal Government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Superior Court (or Court of Common Pleas) of the County in which the principal office of the Corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization as said Corporation shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
