AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE CONGDON AND CARPENTER COMPANY. Passed May 28, 1891.

*It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:*

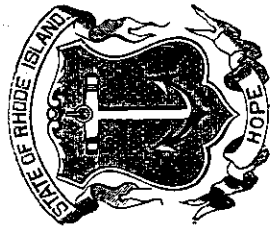
SECTION 1. Francis W. Carpenter, Johns H. Congdon, Albert C. Day, and Henry C. Bangs, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby created a corporation by the name of The Congdon and Carpenter Company, for the purpose of purchasing and selling iron, steel, carriage, and saddlery hardware, harnesses, and general blacksmiths' supplies, and for the transaction of any other business connected therewith or incidental thereto, with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the duties and liabilities, set forth in Chapters 152 and 155 of the Public Statutes, and in any acts in amendment thereof or in addition thereto.

SEC. 2. The capital stock of said corporation shall be a sum not exceeding five hundred thousand dollars, to be fixed in amount from time to time by the by-laws or vote of the corporation, and shall be divided into shares of one hundred dollars each.

SEC. 3. The stock or shares of each stockholder shall be pledged and liable for all debts and demands of every nature due and owing from the owner thereof to said corporation, and whether the same be overdue or payable at a future day, and whether arising from installments or assessments, or in any other manner; and said stock or shares may be sold for the payment of such debts and demands in such manner as the by-laws of said corporation may prescribe; and in case the proceeds of such sale shall be insufficient to discharge such debts or demands, with the incidental expenses of sale, the corporation may have its action against the debtor for the balance due.

SEC. 4. Said corporation shall have a counting-room or place of business in the city of Providence.

SEC. 5. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
