AN ACT IN AMENDMENT OF SECTION 1 OF THE ACT, ENTITLED "AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE EAST SMITHFIELD WATER DISTRICT." APPROVED FEBRUARY 23, 1934.

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 1 of the act, entitled "An act to incorporate the East Smithfield water district," passed at the January session, A. D. 1934 and approved February 23, 1934, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 1. All that part of the towns of Smithfield and North Providence, enclosed by a line beginning at a point in the southerly boundary line of said town of Smithfield, where the easterly boundary line of the town of Johnston and the westerly boundary line of the town of North Providence meet; thence southerly by and with the westerly boundary line of the town of North Providence to a point in said westerly boundary line of said town of North Providence five hundred feet northerly from the intersection of said westerly boundary line of North Providence and the northerly line of the Powder Mill turnpike (now called Putnam avenue); thence easterly in a line parallel with said northerly line of said Powder Mill turnpike to the easterly line of the Farnum turnpike (now called Waterman avenue); thence easterly and parallel with the boundary line between the town of Smithfield and the town of North Providence, a distance of one-half mile; thence northerly and parallel with the easterly line of said Farnum pike to the said North Providence-Smithfield boundary line; thence northerly in a straight line to the intersection of the easterly

line of the Old Smithfield road (now called Ridge road) and the southerly line of Lantern road (now called Whipple road); thence easterly by and with said southerly line of said Lantern road two hundred feet to a point in said southerly line of said Lantern road, thence northerly and westerly in a line parallel with and two hundred feet distant from said Old Smithfield road, crossing the branch of said Old Smithfield road that leads through and past the mill and mill village of Stillwater, and following the branch of said Old Smithfield road that leads past the Capron grist mill and the Stillwater railroad station, parallel with and two hundred feet distant and northerly from said last mentioned branch of said Old Smithfield road to the center line of the old Providence and Springfield railroad right of way; thence southerly in a straight line to a point in the westerly line of said Farnum pike six hundred feet northerly from the intersection of the westerly line of said Farnum pike and the northwesterly line of Old County road; thence southerly and southeasterly in a line parallel with and six hundred feet westerly from said northwesterly line of said Old County road to a point in the northerly line of the road leading from the village of Georgiaville over Wolf hill to Flat Rock; *beginning at a point on the northerly side of Wolf Hill road, in said town of Smithfield, six hundred feet westerly from said Old County road, it being also a bound of Northwestern Water Company; thence southerly with the line of 'the Northwestern Water Company' in a straight line to a point on the northeasterly side of Putnam avenue, in said town of Smithfield, two hundred feet westerly from the Seville road; thence southeasterly with the line of the 'Northwestern Water Company' in a straight line to a point*

on the Johnston-Smithfield line; thence easterly along said Johnston-Smithfield line; thence easterly along said Johnston-Smithfield line to a point on the north-easterly line side of Putnam avenue; thence easterly by and with said southerly boundary line of said town of Smithfield to the point of beginning, is hereby incorporated into a district to be called 'East Smithfield water district.' The purpose of the district shall be to secure, maintain and provide a water supply and water service for all purposes including fire protection, manufacturing and domestic uses, and for providing any other public service excepting electric power and light, telephone, transportation and gas, in said towns of Smithfield and North Providence within and without the district, and within the adjacent town of Johnston, except such portions of said towns as are now served by a water company owned and or operated by a town or city and excepting that portion of the town of Johnston that is now served by an incorporated water company; provided, however, that said corporation may, if it so desires, sell water to any incorporated water company and/or water company owned and operated by a town or city. Said district may have a common seal, sue and be sued and enjoy the other powers generally incident to corporations."

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage and all acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
