AN ACT IN AMENDMENT OF AN ACT ENTITLED "AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE AND ENABLE THE YEARLY MEETING OF FRIENDS FOR NEW ENGLAND, TO RECEIVE, HOLD, MANAGE, APPROPRIATE AND DISPOSE OF PROPERTY FOR CHARITABLE AND BENEVOLENT AND OTHER PURPOSES.

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

Section 1. The corporation known as the Yearly Meeting of Friends in New England, is hereby authorized to hold annual meetings, not oftener than once in every two years hereafter, in the state of Maine, for such purposes as the like meetings have heretofore been held in this state whenever said corporation shall, by the law of Maine, be permitted and authorized to hold such meetings for such purposes in that state, and the election of officers of said corporation and all votes passed, and all business transacted by said corporation at the meeting that may be so holden in Maine, shall be as valid, binding and effectual to all intents and purposes as though said corporate meetings had been holden in this state.
