thereof, as is repugnant to the provisions of this act, be and the same is hereby repealed.

An act in amendment of an act incorporating the Minister, Church Wardens, Vestry and Congregation of St. Michael's Church, passed at June session A. D. 1820.

St. Mich-Be it enacted by the General Assembly, and by the Bristol. authority thereof it is enacted, that the said corporation shall be, and hereby is authorized to impose, levy and collect from the pews in their church edifice, according to their relative value, to be ascertained by a committee to be by them appointed for that purpose, such taxes from time to time, as may in their opinion be necessary, to defray the expense of insuring, repairing and preserving their church edifice and its enclosures; and to enforce the payment of such taxes by sale of the pews on which the taxes shall remain unpaid for the space of sixty days after they shall become payable, according to such by-laws as may be adopted by said corporation: Provided that the surplus remaining after payment of such taxes and expenses of sale, shall be paid over to the owner or owners of said pews.

An act to incorporate certain persons as a society by the name of St. Luke's Church in East Greenwich.

Whereas divers persons have petitioned this general assembly for an act of incorporation, to enable them and their associates to establish and maintain a religious society, according to the rites and usages of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States of America.

St. Lukes' Section I. Be it enacted by the General Assembly, and by the authority thereof it is enacted, that Charles Eldredge, Joseph J. Tillinghast, and Daniel Greene, together with their associates, whose names are sub-

scribed to the petition referred to in the preamble to this act, and such others as may hereafter become

cembers of this corporation, be, and they and their ccessors forever, are hereby created a body corpoe and politic with perpetual succession, by the me of St. Luke's Church in East Greenwich; for purpose of establishing and supporting public orship, in any church or place of worship that may occupied or owned by said corporation, according. the rites and usages of the protestant episcopal hurch of the united states; and the said society are ereby authorized and full power is hereby given unto them, to take, receive and hold all monies and other coperty raised by voluntary subscription, contribuon and donation; and also to receive and hold all egacies and estates real or personal, which have been eretofore, or may at any time hereafter be given. And they are also empowered to have, possess and equire lands, tenements, hereditaments, or any goods and chattels, to an amount not exceeding in value at any one time, twenty thousand dollar; and all and singular the estate, and property aforesaid, to lease, grant, convey, or dispose of, in such manner as they may judge expedient, at their will and pleasure; to hay judge expedient, at their the same to break, have and use a common seal, and the same to break, lter or renew at pleasure; and shall be capable in w as a body corporate, to sue and be sued, to plead and be impleaded, defend and be defended against, in all courts and places, and before all proper judges whatever.

Sec. 2. And be it further enacted, that there shall be meeting of the society aforesaid, on Easter Monday, rearly forever, for the purpose of regulating their business, electing wardens, vestry secretary and treasurer; and the minister, wardens and a majority of the vestry, he, and they are hereby authorised to convene said society at any time and place in East-Greenwich when they may judge it advantageous to the interest of the

Sec. 3. And be it further enacted, that the wardens and vestry who have been elected to their respective offices, be, and they are hereby continued in office

sentil the annual meeting on Easter Monday next. Sec. 4. And be it further enacted, That the vestry of St. Lukes Church for the time being, a majority of whom shall constitute a quorum, may hold meetings

at such times as they may think proper, for the purpose of exercising a general superintendence and direction over the concerns and disposition of the funds of the corporation, for the purposes specified in this act, and for the promotion of its interests, and the furtherance of public worship according to the rites and usages of the protestant episcopal church in the United States: Provided that no transfer of the permanent funds or property of said corporation shall be valid unless assented to at a legal meeting of the corporation.

Sec. 5. And be it further enacted, that a proper book or books shall be provided by the society, for the purpose of registering and keeping an accurate account of all subscriptions, contributions, legacies and donations made to their society; and also the names of thedonors, and their places of residence, and the time of

their being made. Sec. 6. And be it further enacted, that the said society at any of their meetings, may admit into their body such persons as shall wish to become members; and may appoint committees to prosecute the orders of the society, and to audit the treasurer's accounts, as often as they shall think proper. And full power is hereby granted unto the said society at any of their meetings, to make such rules, regulations and by-laws as they or the majority of them shall agree to, for the better regulating the affairs of said society; provided that such rules or by-laws be not contrary or repugnant to this act, the laws of this state, or of the United States.

Sec. 7. And be it further enacted, that said corporation shall be and are hereby empowered to assess and levy on the pews of their church, in a ratable proportion to the fixed valuation thereof, to be hereafter made by said corporation, and to collect from the owners of such pews, all sums of money they may vote to be necessary and requisite, for the repairs and insurance of said church; and in case said taxes so assessed shall remain unpaid for the space of ninety days after assessment, the pews on which the same are assessed and remain unpaid, may be sold at public auction, at such time and under such restrictions, and by such officers as the said corporation shall cect; and the surplus remaining after payment of the taxes and expenses of sale, shall be paid over to owner or owners of said pews.

Sec. 8. And be it further enacted, that this act of corporation shall be forever subject to all acts of the neral assembly, in amendment or repeal thereof, or any way affecting the same.

Upon the petitions of Benjamin Colvin and David D Track Trask, convicts now confined in jail in the county of et. al. liberation: Voted and resolverated, that the prayer of said petitions be, and the same hereby granted; and the sheriff of said county is hereby authorised and directed to release them from fail accordingly.

Upon the petition of Ruby Ann Vaughn, now of RAVangha Providence in the county of Providence, praying for the reasons therein stated, that she may be authorized to prefer a petition to the next term of the supreme judicial court in said county, for divorce from her husband Christopher Vaughn, and in the same manner as if she had resided within this state for the space of three years before her preferring said petition: Voted and resolved, that the prayer of said petition be, and the same is hereby granted; and that she is hereby
