

(NON-BUSINESS CORPORATION)

Know all Men by these Presents, That we JIMMIE L. COUNCILL, ALICE C. Mc-
DONALD and THOMAS PERRY, JR. of the City and County of Providence,
State of Rhode Island, EUNICE BURR CLAFLIN and MARGARET M. WALKER, of
the City of Pawtucket in said County and State, WALTER H. LEVY, of the
City of Warwick, County of Kent in said State, and ROBERT S. BURGESS,
of the Town of Warren, County of Bristol in said State,
all of lawful age, hereby agree to and with each other:

FIRST. To associate ourselves together with the intention of forming a corporation
under and by virtue of the powers conferred by Chapter 7-6 of the General Laws of
Rhode Island, as amended.

SECOND. Said corporation shall be known by the name of
HOMEMAKER - HOME HEALTH AIDE SERVICES OF RHODE ISLAND

THIRD. Said corporation is constituted for the purpose of rendering assistance
to families that have been or could be disrupted by illness
or other causes, through the development, implementation, and sup-
port of a state-wide homemaker and home health aide services pro-
gram, including both the direct administration of such program and
the assisting of local agencies in the administration of such program.

Said corporation shall be authorized to receive and administer
grants-in-aid, donations and endowments of every kind and nature
from individuals, foundations, trusts, corporations, public bodies
and governmental agencies in connection with such purposes.

Said corporation is organized without capital stock and shall be
operated exclusively for charitable, scientific or educational pur-
poses. No part of the activities of the corporation shall be carried
on for profit. It is intended that said corporation shall be of the
character described in Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue
Code of the United States.

In addition to the foregoing, said corporation shall have the following powers and
authority, viz:—(See §§ 7-6-7, 7-6-8 of the General Laws.)

To do any lawful act which is necessary or proper to accomplish the purposes of its incorporation. Without limiting or
enlarging the effect of this general grant of authority, it is hereby specifically provided that every such corporation shall have
power:

- (a) to have perpetual succession in its corporate name ~~unless a period for its duration is limited in its articles of associa-
tion or charter;~~
- (b) to sue and be sued in its corporate name;
- (c) to have and use a common seal and alter the same at pleasure;
- (d) to elect such officers and appoint such agents as its purposes require, and to fix their compensation and define their
duties;
- (e) to make by-laws not inconsistent with the Constitution or laws of the United States or of this state, or with the
corporation's charter or articles of association, determining the time and place of holding and the manner of calling and of conduct-
ing meetings of its members and directors, the manner of electing its officers and directors, the mode of voting by proxy, and
the number, qualifications, powers, duties and term of office of its officers and directors, and containing any other provisions,
whether of the same or of a different nature, for the management of the corporation's property and the regulation and government
of its affairs;
- (f) to make contracts, incur liabilities and borrow money.

Said corporation shall be entitled to take, hold, transmit and convey real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding
in all one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000); provided, however, that the foregoing limitation shall not apply to corporations
organized for the purposes of fostering, encouraging and assisting the physical location, settlement or resettlement of industrial and
manufacturing enterprises within the state, and to whose members no profit shall ensue. If any corporation subject to the foregoing
limitation desires to take and hold property to an amount exceeding one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) either originally
or by amendment, such privilege shall be granted only by the general assembly on petition thereto

FOURTH. Said corporation shall be located in Providence, Rhode Island.
(City or Town)

(Further provisions not inconsistent with law)

FIFTH. In no event shall any part of the net earnings or property of said corporation inure to the benefit of or be distributable to its members, officers, directors or other private individuals, or be used or appropriated for other than said purposes, except that said corporation shall be authorized to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered. No substantial part of the activities of said corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and said corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distributing of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

SIXTH. In the event of dissolution, winding up, or other liquidation of the assets of said corporation, whether voluntary, involuntary or by operation of law, its assets shall be distributed to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, scientific or educational purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Revenue Law), as the Board of Directors shall determine.
