2. Mail in your completed Annual Report form (available for download at www.sos.ri.gov/business) along with a check or money order for \$75 payable to "Secretary of State".
3. Stop by our office, located at 148 West River Street, Providence, and file your completed Annual Report form in person. Payment is accepted via cash, credit card, check or money order.

R.I.G.L. 7-1.2-1501(e), states that any corporation failing or refusing to file its annual report for any year within thirty (30) days after the time prescribed by law is subject to a penalty fee of \$25.00. **Please file your Annual Report for the year 2017 along with payment in the amount of \$75.00 that includes both the annual report filing fee and required penalty fee.** The filing must be made with the Office of the Secretary of State, Division of Business Services, within the next sixty (60) days to ensure your authority to conduct business will remain intact.
