ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION.

Know all Men by these Presents, That we *Matthew Perkins, of Providence, William B. Meenan, DeLancey Kane, Andrew K. Quinn, Philip E. Clarke, Frederick P. Garretton, John C. Burke, Nicholas E. Dwyer, James B. Cottrell,* all of the State of Rhode Island -
all of lawful age, hereby agree to and with each other:

1st. To associate ourselves together for the purpose of constituting a corporation under and by virtue of the powers conferred by Chapter 176 of the General Laws of the State of Rhode Island.

2d. Said corporation shall be known by the name of *"The Saint Clare Home"*

3d. Said corporation is constituted for the purpose of *aiding the poor generally as an incorporated public charitable institution, especially by providing nurses, whose duty it is to visit sick persons deprived of proper care; to care for them at their homes; to instruct members of the household in the simple rules of hygiene and of protection against contagious diseases. Furthermore to found and maintain day nurseries for the care and instruction of poor children in the city of Newport.*
All of said services to be without compensation.

4th. Said corporation shall be located in *Newport, Rhode Island.*
