FIRST. To associate ourselves together with the intention of forming a corporation	
under and by virtue of the powers conferred by Chapter 7-6 of the General Laws of	
Rhode Island, as amended.	
SECOND. Said corporation shall be known by the name of	
WESTERLY SENIOR CITIZENS CENTER ASSOCIATION	
THIRD. Said corporation is constituted for the purpose of providing and	
maintaining a center catering to the needs and interests of the Senior Citizen	
of the Town of Westerly, Rhode Island, the making of distributions to	
organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501 (c) (3)	
of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any	
future United States Internal Revenue Law), for any other purpose parmitted	
by law.	
In addition to the foregoing, said corporation shall have the following powers and	
authority, viz:—(See §§ 7-6-7. 7-6-8 of the General Laws.)	
To do any lawful act which is necessary or proper to accomplish the purposes of its incorporation. Without limiting or enlarging the effect of this general grant of authority, it is hereby specifically provided that every such corporation shall have power:	
(a) to have perpetual succession in its corporate name unless a period for its duration is limited in its articles of association or charter; (b) to sue and be sued in its corporate name;	
 (c) to have and use a common seal and alter the same at pleasure; (d) to elect such officers and appoint such agests as its purposes require, and to fix their compensation and define their 	
duties; (e) to make by-laws not inconsistent with the Constitution or laws of the United States or of this state, or with the corporation's charter or articles of association, determining the time and place of holding and the manner of calling and of conducting meetings of its members and directors, the manner of electing its officers and directors, the mode of voting by proxy, and the number, qualifications, powers, duties and term of office of its officers and directors, and containing any other provisions, whether of the same or of a different nature, for the management of the corporation's property and the regulation and government of its affairs;	
(f) to make contracts, incur liabilities and borrow money. Said corporation shall be entitled to take, hold, transmit and convey real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding in all one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000); provided, however, that the foregoing limitation shall not apply to corporations organized for the purposes of fostering, encouraging and assisting the physical location, settlement or resettlement of industrial and manufacturing enterprises within the state, and to whose members no profit shall enter. If any corporation subject to the foregoing limitation desires to take and hold property to an amount exceeding one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) either originally or by amendment, such privilege shall be granted only by the general assembly on petition thereto
