To import and export and buy, sell, and generally deal in household goods and house furnishings, furniture, carpets, rugs, beds, bedding, blankets, quilts, stoves, lamps, electric lamps and fixtures, radios, clocks, curtains, draperies, portieres, kitchen utensils, vacuum cleaners, electric household appliances of all types, and every other thing that is or may be used in furnishing a house. To acquire, by purchase or otherwise, real estate and plants necessary to conduct such business.

To manufacture, invent, design, improve, construct, assemble, prepare for market, purchase, or otherwise acquire, hold, own, use, import, export, trade, and otherwise deal in and turn to account, lease, license, hire, sell, or otherwise dispose of all types and kinds of appliances, products, parts, components, supplies, fixtures, and equipment, for household, industrial, and commercial uses, including without limitation refrigerators, refrigeration equipment, parts and appliances, electric and electronic devices, radio parts and equipment, and any other articles, products, appliances, and devices; to design, manufacture, construct, prepare for market, purchase, or otherwise acquire, hold, own, use, import, export, trade, or otherwise deal in or turn to account, lease, hire, sell, or otherwise dispose of, supplies, products, articles, appliances, and accessories used in connection with the construction, equipment, use, operation, adornment, repair, and rebuilding of all types and kinds of products, appliances, devices and apparatus, refrigerators and refrigeration equipment, radios and radio equipment, electric and electronic equipment, and any other articles, products, appliances, and devices; and to establish, maintain, and operate plants, foundries, machine shops, repair shops, and other shops and factories for the manufacture and repair of any of such articles, products, appliances, and devices and for any other lawful purpose.
