a. The ways in which the benefit corporation pursued general public benefit during the year and the extent to which general public benefit was created:

Each year, Lederberg Business Law, Inc. ("Lederberg Business Law"), as a Rhode Island benefit corporation, pursues general public benefit, by providing legal services on a no fee and/or reduced fee basis ("legal services"), to certain Rhode Island based social enterprises that generate a general public benefit. By helping these social mission organizations, which themselves collectively have or will assist and impact hundreds and even thousands of individuals on a local, state and regional level, Lederberg Business Law greatly magnifies the impact of its legal services in creating general public benefit. Lederberg Business Law created positive general environmental and societal public benefits by providing legal services to the PeaceLove Foundation, a local 501c3 organization, supporting mental wellness through creative expression, respectively and the Providence Speaking Society, a local 501c3 organization, promoting public awareness of local matters.

b. The ways in which the benefit corporation pursued a specific public benefit that the Articles of Incorporation state is the purpose of the benefit corporation and the extent to which that specific public benefit was created:

Lederberg Business Law used the online Best for Rhode Island platform ("B-RI) to provide third party independent assessment criteria for validating the extent of Lederberg Business Law's general public benefit. B-RI employs well-known standards generated by B-Labs to objectively determine the extent of a benefit corporation's general public benefit impact, using a set of specific, measurable and applicable criteria numerically scored by category and aggregated to reflect an overall score on a grading scale from 0 to 200 (with 0 being the lowest and 200 being the highest)("B-Impact"). When such B Impact is certified by B-RI, a score of 80 or more will qualify as "Certified B Corp".

The results from the B Impact Assessment, performed internally on a pro forma and uncertified basis are as follows by category, with all figures rounded down to the nearest single digit: Governance: 21; Workers: 36; Community: 56; Environment: 14 and Customers: 5; for a total aggregate score of 132 out of a possible 200.
