STATE OF RHODE ISLAND AND PROVIDENCE PLANTATIONS.

WHEREAS, on the fifth day of February, A. D. 1902, Harry Fulford, George M. Hobart and Albert A. Baker, filed in the office of the Secretary of State according to law, their agreement to form a corporation under the name of The Fulford & Hobart Company for the purpose of manufacturing, selling and dealing in metal ornaments, jewelers findings and tools, and jewelry of every description, and for the transaction of any other business connected therewith or incidental thereto, and with the capital stock of Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000) and also filed the certificate of the General Treasurer that they had paid into the General Treasury of the State the fee required by law;

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of a vote representing in amount the entire capital stock, passed at a meeting of the stock-holders of said corporation duly called for that purpose held on the 30th day of September, A. D. 1915, it was voted that said charter be amended by changing the name of said corporation to "Fulford Manufacturing Company."

The following is a true copy of said resolution:--
RESOLVED: That the name of this corporation be changed from The Fulford & Hobart Company to Fulford Manufacturing Company.
