AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE PROVIDENCE YACHT CLUB.

Passed Feb.
23, 1877.

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows :

SECTION 1. Addison H. White, Henry J. Steere, Wm. L. Beckwith, Harvey J. Flint and such other persons as are now associated as a yacht club in the city of Providence, or may hereafter become associated with them, are hereby constituted a body corporate by the name of the Providence Yacht Club, to be located in the city of Providence for the purpose of encouraging yacht building and improvement in seamanship and the cultivation of naval science.

SEC. 2. The said corporation shall have power to make and adopt a constitution, by-laws, rules and regulations for the admission and government of its members, as well as for their suspension and expulsion; for the election of its officers and defining their duties, and for the safe keeping, management and disposition of its funds. It may also from time to time alter or repeal such constitution, by-laws, rules and regulations.

SEC. 3. The trustees of said corporation shall consist of three members of the club who are or who shall be for the time being, owners of yachts duly enrolled on the records of the club. The said trustees shall be elected annually.

SEC. 4. The said corporation may purchase and hold or lease any real or personal estate, but the value of the real estate so held by it shall not exceed twenty thousand dollars.

SEC. 5. The said corporation shall also possess the powers and be subject to the restrictions and liabilities contained in the one hundred and thirty-ninth chapter, nineteenth title of the General Statutes of Rhode Island.

SEC. 6. This act shall take effect on its passage.

AN ACT TO AMEND AN ACT ENTITLED "AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE PROVIDENCE YACHT CLUB," PASSED AT THE JANUARY SESSION, 1877. Passed Feb. 24, 1887.

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows :

SECTION 1. Section 1 of an act entitled "An act to incorporate the Providence Yacht Club," is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

"SECTION 1. Addison H. White, Henry J. Steere,
" William L. Beckwith, Harvey J. Flint and such other persons as are now associated as a yacht club in the state of Rhode Island, or may hereafter become associated with them, are hereby constituted a body corporate by the name of the Rhode Island Yacht Club, the annual meetings of said club to be held in the county of Providence, for the purpose of encouraging yacht building and improvement in seamanship and the cultivation of naval science."

SEC. 2. Section 2 of said act is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

"SEC. 3. The trustees of said corporation shall consist of three members of the club, to be elected annually."

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage, and all acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
