ACTS AND RESOLVES

PROVIDENCE PLANTATIONS

JANUARY SESSION, 1872

Harriet Symonds, Laura T. Balch and Harriet L. Tibbits, their associates and successors, are hereby made a corporation by the name of "The Providence Nursery" for the purpose of aiding and providing for the children of poor persons, with all the powers and privileges and subject to all the duties and liabilities set forth in chapter 125 of the Revised Statutes, and of any acts in amendment thereof or in addition thereto.

Sec. 2. Said corporation may take, hold, transmit and convey property, real and personal, to an amount not exceeding twenty thousand dollars.

AN ACT IN AMENDMENT OF AN ACT ENTITLED "AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE WOONSOCKET UNIVERSALIST SOCIETY OF YOUNG MEN."

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. The first section of the act of which this is an amendment, is hereby amended by striking out of said section the words "ten thousand dollars," and inserting instead thereof the words "fifty thousand dollars."

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE PEACE DALE CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH.

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. George W. Fisher, Henry Booth, George Booth, Joseph Williams, Rowland Hazard, Elizabeth Clemens, Margaret R. Hazard and their associates and successors, members of the Congregational Church in Peace Dale, in the town of South Kingstown, are hereby created a body corporate by the name of the "Peace Dale Congregational Church," and by that name shall have all the privileges and shall be subject to all the liabilities granted and imposed by chapter 125 of the Revised Statutes, and by all acts in amendment thereof or in addition thereto.

AN ACT TO INCORPORATE PILGRIM LODGE, No. 19, OF THE INDEPENDENT ORDER OF ODD FELLOWS, IN THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE.

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. John King, John Henry Bongartz, Apolos Seekel, 2d, Thomas E. Eddy, Jesse P. Eddy, John W. Angell, Christopher A. Cady, Henry Marsh, George W. Flagg, John Gardner, William E. Whiting, William B. W. Hallett and such others as now are or may hereafter become members of said Lodge, are hereby created a body corporate with perpetual succession by the name of "Pilgrim Lodge, No. 19, of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows in the city of Providence," for charitable purposes and mutual benefit, with all the powers and privileges and subject to all the duties and liabilities set forth in chapter 125 of the Revised Statutes and of the Statutes in amendment thereof or in addition thereto.

Sec. 2. Said Lodge shall have power to receive and hold, transmit and convey any real or personal estate not exceeding twenty thousand dollars in value.

Sec. 3. Said corporation may elect at such times, in such manner and for such periods, a noble grand, vice grand, secretary, permanent secretary and treasurer, as the laws of the Grand Lodge of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows may require, and such other officers as may be deemed necessary for the transaction of its business.

AN ACT TO INCORPORATE ROGER WILLIAMS LODGE, No. 3, OF THE INDEPENDENT ORDER OF ODD FELLOWS, IN THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE.

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. William H. Greene, Winfield S. Tompkins, Henry A. Chace, W. L. Wilmurth, L. Anderson, Francis Cusick, and such others as now are or may hereafter become members of said Lodge, are hereby created a body politic and corporate, by the name of "Roger Williams Lodge, No. 3, of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows, in the city of Providence," for mutual benefit and charitable purposes, and by that
