WE, the undersigned Officers of

APPONAUG PENTECOSTAL CHURCH

a corporation duly incorporated under the laws of the State of Rhode Island,
HEREBY CERTIFY, that at a legal meeting of said corporation, duly called for the purpose,
and held in the CITY of WARWICK
in said State, on the 25th day of MARCH, A. D. 1977,
the following amendment(s) to the Articles of Association was (or were) duly adopted by
the affirmative vote of ALL of its members viz:—
"VOTED, That

REVISED CONSTITUTION OF APPONAUG PENTECOSTAL CHURCH

Article 1. Name

The Name of this church shall be APPONAUG PENTECOSTAL CHURCH.

Article 2. Location

The principal office of the church is to be in the State of Rhode Island in the City of Warwick, Kent County.

Article 3. Purpose

Said church is established to maintain a place for the worship of Almighty God, our Heavenly Father, as known through His only Son, our Savior, Jesus Christ as declared in His Holy Word and quickened to us by His Holy Spirit.

The full Gospel of Jesus Christ is to be proclaimed and published by every possible means, and all people within our influence, irrespective of nationality, social rank or race are to be encouraged to accept the full Salvation which is in the Lord Jesus Christ.

Our responsibility and privilege in propagation of the Full Gospel truth at home and in foreign lands is to be met by going as missionaries as may be possible, by giving of our means and by faithful prayer.

We as a body of believers deem it desirable as much as seems possible to cooperate with any and all Full Gospel bodies.

Article 4. Finances

All funds for the maintenance of the church and its program shall be provided by the voluntary tithes and offerings of the members and friends of the church or possible future legacies.

No part of the net earnings of the church shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributed to, its members, officers or private persons or organizations except that the church shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article Three hereof.

Article 5. Activity Limitations

No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propoganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the church shall not participate in, or intervene in political campaigns on behalf of any candidate for public office. This includes the publishing or distribution of statements concerning legislation or political campaigns.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this constitution, the church shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c) (2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

Article 6. Dissolution

Upon dissolution of the church, the Officers shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of the assets of the corporation exclusively for the purposes of the corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for religious purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization under section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) as the Officers shall determine. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Court of Common Pleas of the county in which the principal office of the church is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations as said Court shall determine which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
