ORIGINAL ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION.

(NON-BUSINESS CORPORATION.)

Know all Men by these Presents. That we Joseph S.L. Wharton, William M.
C. Kimber, Duncan I. Selfridge, William P. Sheffield and John R.
Haire
all of lawful age, hereby agree to and with each other:
First. To associate ourselves together with the intention of forming a corporation
under and by virtue of the powers conferred by Article III of Chapter 248 of the General
Laws of Rhode Island.
Second. Said corporation shall be known by the name of
Dumplings' Association, Incorporated
Tunn. Said corporation is constituted for the purpose of
(a) Working for the abatement of threatened nuisances and checking
undesirable developments in the town of Jamestown, such as, fish
house, gum factories, mills and hotels in the vicinity of the Dumplings, so-called, in the town of Jamestown. (b) Preserving the natural beauties of the Dumplings, so-called in the town of Jamestown. (c) Working for the laying out of new roads and improving the town by the extension and ornamentation of existing public streets.
highways, beaches and grounds, in the vicinity of the Dumplings, so-called (d) Doing, in accordance with law, all other acts and things as shall from time to time appear to be for the present and future welfare of the community in the vicinity of the Dumplings, so-called, in the town of Jamestown.
In addition to the foregoing, said corporation shall have the following powers and
authority, viz:— (See Sec. 75, Chapter 24S of the General Laws.) To do any lawful act which is necessary or proper to accomplish the purposes of its incorporation. Without limiting or enlarging the effect of this general grant of authority, it is hereby specifically provided that said corporation shall have power: (a) to have perpetual succession in its corporate name, unless a period for its duration is limited in these articles of association;
(b) to sue and be sued in its corporate name; (c) to have and use a common scal, and after the same at pleasure; (d) to elect such officers and appoint such agents as its purposes require, and to fix their compensation and define their duties;
(e) to make by-laws not inconsistent with the constitution or laws of the United States or of this state, or with those articles of association, determining the time and place of holding and the manner of calling and of conducting meetings of its members and directors, the manner of electing its officers and directors, the mode of voting by proxy, and the number, qualifications, powers, duties and term of office of its officers and directors, and containing any other provisions, whether of the same or of a different nature, for the management of the corporation's property and the regulation and government of its affairs;

(f) to make contracts, incur liabilities and borrow money.

Said corporation shall be entitled to take, hold, transmit and convey real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding in all one hundred fifty thousand dollars. But if it desires to take and hold property to an amount exceeding one hundred fifty thousand dollars either originally or by amendment, such privilege shall be granted only by the general assembly on petition thereto.
