ORIGINAL ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION
(NON-BUSINESS CORPORATION)

Know all Men by these Presents, That we Kenneth D. Haupt, James C. Hasenfus, Janet L. Gillen, Russell C. Dannecker, Brian T. Taft

all of lawful age, hereby agree to and with each other:

FIRST. To associate ourselves together with the intention of forming a corporation under and by virtue of the powers conferred by Chapter 7-6 of the General Laws of Rhode Island, as amended.

SECOND. Said corporation shall be known by the name of Rhode Island College Student Community Government Inc.

THIRD. Said corporation is constituted for the purpose of efficient and responsible administration of the revenues of the Rhode Island College Student Community Government through developing, funding, co-ordinating, evaluating, implementing, owning and operating student organized enterprises, facilities and activities such as the Theatre, Fine Arts Series, Community Service, campus newspaper, Yearbook, Day Care Center, Pell Tiernan Intern Program Concert Series in the field of student services, education and entertainment for the benefit and promotion of the general welfare of the Rhode Island College Community and community at large.

In addition to the foregoing, said corporation shall have the following powers and authority, viz:—(See §§ 7-6-7, 7-6-8 of the General Laws.)

To do any lawful act which is necessary or proper to accomplish the purposes of its incorporation. Without limiting or enlarging the effect of this general grant of authority, it is hereby specifically provided that every such corporation shall have power:

- (a) to have perpetual succession in its corporate name unless a period for its duration is limited in its articles of association or charter;
(b) to sue and be sued in its corporate name;
(c) to have and use a common seal and alter the same at pleasure;
(d) to elect such officers and appoint such agents as its purposes require, and to fix their compensation and define their duties;
(e) to make by-laws not inconsistent with the Constitution or laws of the United States or of this state, or with the corporation's charter or articles of association, determining the time and place of holding and the manner of calling and of conducting meetings of its members and directors, the manner of electing its officers and directors, the mode of voting by proxy, and the number, qualifications, powers, duties and term of office of its officers and directors, and containing any other provisions, whether of the same or of a different nature, for the management of the corporation's property and the regulation and government of its affairs;
(f) to make contracts, incur liabilities and borrow money.

Said corporation shall be entitled to take, hold, transmit and convey real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding in all one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000); provided, however, that the foregoing limitation shall not apply to corporations organized for the purposes of fostering, encouraging and assisting the physical location, settlement or re-settlement of industrial and manufacturing enterprises within the state, and to whose members no profit shall ensue. If any corporation subject to the foregoing limitation desires to take and hold property to an amount exceeding one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) either originally or by amendment, such privilege shall be granted only by the general assembly on petition thereto

FOURTH. Said corporation shall be located in North Providence, Rhode Island.

FIFTH Membership of said corporation shall be limited to  
members of the Rhode Island College Student Community Govern-  
ment Student Parliament.

SIXTH Said Corporation shall, at all times, be subject to  
limitations placed upon it by the Rhode Island College Student  
Parliament.
