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## ORIGINAL ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION

(NON-BUSINESS CORPORATION)

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Know all Men by these Presents, That we Peter L. Hogue, Louis M. Macktaz,
Elphege J. Goulet, Francis A. Fleurant, Arthur J. Chianese, John J. McLaughlin
Edward J. Hayden and Joseph P. O. Lambert,
all of lawful age, hereby agree to and with each other:
FIRST. To associate ourselves together with the intention of forming a corporation
under and by virtue of the powers conferred by Chapter 7-6 of the General Laws of Rhode Island.
SECOND. Said corporation shall be known by the name of
Sher-Le-Mon Swim Club, Inc.
THIRD. Said corporation is constituted for the purpose of
To own and operate a swimming club; to buy, lease, rent, hold,
improve and otherwise to deal in real property for purposes not
inconsistent with the operation of a swimming club.
In addition to the foregoing, said corporation shall have the following powers and authority, viz:—(See §§ 7-6-7, 7-6-8 of the General Laws.)
To do any lawful act which is necessary or proper to accomplish the purposes of its incorporation. Without limiting o colarging the effect of this general grant of authority, it is hereby specifically provided that every such corporation shall have
power:  (a) to have perpetual succession in its corporate name unless a period for its duration is limited in its articles of association or charter;
<ul><li>(b) to sue and be sued in its corporate name;</li><li>(c) to have and use a common scal and alter the same at pleasure;</li></ul>
(d) to elect such officers and appoint such agents as its purposes require, and to fix their compensation and define their duties:  (e) to make by laws not inconsistent with the Constitution or laws of the United States or of this state, or with the
corporation's charter or articles of essociation, determining the time and place of bolding and the manner of calling and of conducting meetings of its members and directors, the manner of electing its officers and directors, the mode of voting by proxy, sint the number, qualifications, powers, duties and term of office of its officers and directors, and containing any other provisions whether of the same or of a different nature for the management of the corporation's property and the regulation and greenman.

whether of the same or of a concrete manage of the same of its affairs;

(I) to make contracts, incur liabilities and borrow money.

Said corporation shall be entitled to take, hold, transmit and convey real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding in all one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000). But if such corporation desires to take and hold property to an amount exceeding one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) either originally or by amendment, such privilege shall be granted only by the general assembly on petition thereto.
