

Articles of Incorporation

River Valley Limited

THIRD: River Valley Limited (the "Corporation") is a non-profit corporation organized exclusively for educational and charitable purposes as described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended (the "Code") and the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder, the principal purpose of which is to establish, maintain and operate food service and other vocational training and rehabilitation programs, and to do all things incidental thereto, for individuals of every race, religion, national origin and color who are handicapped, disabled or who otherwise face barriers to employment because of physical or mental incapacity.

Exhibit B

Articles of Incorporation

River Valley Limited

FOURTH: The Corporation is not organized for profit and no part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of any member, director or officer (except that reasonable compensation may be paid to members, directors and officers for services rendered to and for the Corporation). In the event of the liquidation of the Corporation, whether voluntary or involuntary, no member, director or officer shall be entitled to any distribution or division of the Corporation's property or the proceeds thereof, and upon such liquidation, the balance of all money, assets and other property of the Corporation, after the payment of all its debts and obligations, shall be distributed to COMMUNITY COUNSELING CENTER, INC., a Rhode Island non-profit corporation or a successor corporation ("CCC"), as long as CCC shall be a non-profit corporation exempt from federal income taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or, if CCC shall have dissolved or shall not be exempt from federal income taxation, said assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be

disposed of by a court of competent jurisdiction in the State of Rhode Island, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as such court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
