EXHIBIT A

Purposes of South Kingstown Land Trust

To assist in and promote the preservation and maintenance of areas of open space in and around the Town of South Kingstown, Rhode Island, particularly, but without limitation, for conservation of aquifers, public water resources and land quality and for preservation of woodlands, salt ponds, tidal rivers, shore frontage, marshland, swamps and other wetlands and the animal and plant life therein, parcels of unique historical significance or natural beauty, green acres, farmland and similar open land, areas for the education and training of Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts and similar youth organizations in nature lore, camping and other out-of-door activities and for general public outdoor passive recreation such as swimming, skiing, skating boating and similar activities, the development of walking and riding trails therein, and the establishment of sound conservation practices, and to engage in and encourage others to engage in the scientific study of plants, animals, birds and other wildlife, and the sylvan culture of the area, and in this connection, to acquire by gift, purchase or otherwise real property, conservation easements and personal property, both tangible and intangible, of every sort and description, to use such property, both real and personal, in such manner as the Board of Directors shall deem most appropriate to carry out such purposes and to cooperate in the furtherance of the above purposes with other land trusts or other entities, public or private, in nearby Rhode Island towns; provided, however, that all property owned by this Corporation and the net earnings thereof shall be used in the United States of America exclusively for the benefit of the inhabitants of the area for the conservation, educational and scientific purposes for which the Corporation is formed as set forth herein.

Concerning the Trustees

The Directors of this Corporation shall be known as Trustees. The Trustees hereunder shall hold office until their successors are duly elected, or appointed, and qualified. Only persons who are residents of the Town of South Kingstown shall be eligible to hold the office of Trustee, and any Trustee who ceases to be such a resident shall automatically without any further action, cease to be a Trustee hereunder. If a Trustee shall die, resign or for any other reason cease to be a Trustee hereunder before his or her term of office expires, a successor shall be appointed by the remaining Trustees to fill such vacancy.


Operation of the Corporation

The Corporation shall make every effort to operate in compliance with the 1993 Statement of Land Trust Standards and Practices issued by the Land Trust Alliance.

The Corporation is organized exclusively for, and will operate exclusively as, a non-profit business corporation in conformity with Title 7, Chapter 6 of the General laws of the State of Rhode Island, 1956, as amended, and with Section 501(c)(3) of the United States Internal Revenue Code of 1954, amended.

No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributed to its members, trustees, officers, board of directors, or other private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments in furtherance of the purposes set forth in this paragraph.

Said Corporation shall engage in activities which are incidental to the foregoing purposes but shall not carry on any activities which would cause it to be disqualified as a Corporation receiving tax exemption status pursuant to Section 501(c)(3) of the United States Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended [37]

No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, nor shall the Corporation participate in or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

Upon dissolution of the Corporation, the Board of Directors, (after paying or making provision for the payment of all liabilities of the Corporation,) shall dispose of the assets of the Corporation in such manner, or to such organizations organized and operated exclusively for the purposes as shall, at the time, qualify as an exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended, (or the corresponding provision of any United States Internal Revenue Code), as the Board of Directors shall determine.

The distribution of assets on dissolution shall be to The Nature Conservancy, a Virginia non-profit organization, or its nominee, if then qualifying as an exempt organization.
