ORIGINAL ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION.

(NON-BUSINESS CORPORATION.)

Know all Men by these Fresents. That we W. Frederick Holt, G. P. Lamarine, Norman E. Johnson, Colin G. Thomson, Robert R. Garland, Thomas J. Kennedy
George L. Crawford, Nicholas DiTata, John Gomes, and Jaseph Sebastionelli
all of lawful age, hereby agree to and with each other:
FIRST. To associate ourselves together with the intention of forming a corporation
under and by virtue of the powers conferred by XMXXXIXIX of Chapter XMX the General Laws of Rhode Island.
SECOND. Said corporation shall be known by the name of
SEALOL EMPLOYEES CREDIT UNION
THIRD. Said corporation is constituted for the purpose of operating a credit
union in the City of Warwick, Rhode Island in accordance with Chapter
19-21 General Laws 1956.
In addition to the foregoing, said corporation shall have the following powers and
authority, viz:—(\$25,000, Chapter \$28 of the General Laws.)
To do any lawful set which is necessary or proper to accomplish the purposes of its incorporation. Without limiting or enlarging the effect of this general grant of authority, it is hereby specifically provided that every such corporation shall have power:
(a) to have perpetual succession in its corporate name unless a period for its duration is limited in its articles of association or charter;
(b) to sue and be sued in its corporate name; (c) to have and use a common seal and alter the same at pleasure; (d) to elect such officers and appoint such agents as its purposes require, and to fix their compensation and define their duties;
(e) to make by-laws not inconsistent with the constitution or laws of the United States or of this state, or with the corporation's charter or articles of association, determining the time and place of holding and the manner of calling and of conducting its members and directors, the mode of voting by proxy, and the number, qualifications, powers, duties and term of office of its officers and directors, and containing any other provisions, whether of the same or of a different nature, for the management of the corporation's property and the regulation and government of its affairs;
(f) to make contracte, incur liabilities and borrow money. Said corporation shall be entitled to take, hold, transmit and convey real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding in all \$150,000.00. But if such corporation desires to take end hold property to an amount acceeding \$150,000.00 either originally or by amendment, such privilege shall be granted only by the general assembly on petition thereto.

(Further provisions not inconsistent with law)

FIFTH The corporate existence of this credit union shall be	
limited to such time as its general membership shall continue to	3
be in the employ of Sealol Corporation or the Anchor Tool and	
Die Division, or the successor or successors of such corporation	
and, more specifically, upon liquidation of the Sealol Corporati	•
or the Anchor Tool and Die Division or of their successor or	
successors, or upon their indefinite suspension of business, the	
credit union shall be liquidated according to the provisions of	
19-21-42, General Laws of 1956; or, in case of inability or re-	
fusal to liquidate under said 19-21-42, it shall be the duty of	
the Board of Directors of the credit union to proceed with liqui	
ation in the same manner as such duty is imposed upon them under the provision s of 19-21-4, General Laws of 1956.
