ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION.

Know all Men by these Presents, That we Edward E. Pierce,  
Braden D. Whiting, Harvey K. Nestor,  
George R. Land, Benjamin T. Fossenden,  
Willie H. Stokes

all of lawful age, hereby agree to and with each other:

1st. To associate ourselves together for the purpose of constituting a corporation under and by virtue of the powers conferred by Chapter 176 of the General Laws of the State of Rhode Island.

2d. Said corporation shall be known by the name of The River View  
Improvement Association

3d. Said corporation is constituted for the purpose of facilitating social  
intercourse between the residents of River View  
and vicinity, and to make such general and par-  
ticular improvements as will further their interests,  
enhance their dimensions, and promote the  
general welfare of River View.

4th. Said corporation shall be located in River View in the Town  
of Warwick and the State of Rhode Island

5th. The undersigned hereby waive notice of the first meeting of said corporation which meeting may be called by a majority of the persons named in this agreement in such manner as they may determine, and such meeting shall be organized by the election of a temporary chairman and a temporary clerk.
