To do any lawful act which is necessary or proper to accomplish the purposes of its incorporation. Without limiting callarging the effect of this general grant of authority, it is hereby specifically provided that every such corporation shall have power:	
(a) to have perpetual succession in its corporate name unless a provide for its deretion is limited in its articles of association as sharter;  (b) to sue and be sued in its corporate name;  (c) to have and use a common seal and alter the same at pleasure;  (d) to elect such officers and appoint such agents as its purposes require, and to fix their compensation and define their duties;  (c) to make hy-laws not inconsistent with the Constitution or laws of the United States or of this state, or with the corporation's charter or articles of association, determining the time and place of bolding and the manner of calling and of conductions.	6

the number, qualifications, powers, duties and term of office of its officers and directors, and containing any other provisions, whether of the same or of a different nature, for the management of the corporation's property and the regulation and government of its affairs;

(f) to make contracts, incur liabilities and borrow money.

Said corporation shall be entitled to take, hold, transmit and convey real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding in all one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000); provided, however, that the foregoing limitation shall not apply to corporations organized for the purposes of instering, encouraging and assisting the physical location, settlement or resoltment of industrial and manufacturing enterprises within the state, and to whose members no profit shall ename. If any corporation subject to the foregoing limitation desires to take and hold property to an amount exceeding one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) either originally or by amendment, such privilege shall be granted only by the general assembly on petition thereto
