EXHIBIT A

"THIRD: The purpose or purposes for which the corporation is organized are:

- (a) To grant scholarships for the pursuit of higher education to graduating student-athletes of the Cranston High Schools;
- (b) to do any and all things necessary, suitable or proper for the attainment of any or all of the foregoing, and, subject to the limitations hereinafter contained, to engage in any lawful act or activity for which a non-profit corporation may be organized under Chapter 7-6 of the General Laws of Rhode Island, 1956, as amended, or the corresponding provisions of any future statute enacted in substitute therefore;
- (c) to operate exclusively for charitable and educational purposes consistent with the foregoing in a manner which will not disqualify it as an exempt organization under \$501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or any successor or corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law, and notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, the Corporation shall not engage in or carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by a corporation exempt from federal income taxation pursuant to said Section or any such successor or corresponding provision of law."

EXHIBIT B

"FOURTH: Provisions (if any) for the regulation of internal affairs of the corporation, including provisions for the distribution of assets on dissolution or final liquidation, are:

- 1. The corporation shall have all the powers conferred upon a corporation organized under the provisions of the Rhode Island Non-profit Corporation Act and any enlargement of such powers conferred by subsequent legislative acts, and shall have all powers necessary, proper, convenient or desirable in order to fulfill and further the purposes of the corporation.
- 2. The corporation shall be nonprofit, shall not have or issue shares of capital stock, and shall not declare or pay dividends. No part of the net income or profit of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of any member, director, officer, or other individual, or to the benefit of any organization not qualified for tax exemption under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code except as permitted by law.
- 3. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation (except as otherwise provided by Internal Revenue Code section 501(h), or participating in, or intervening in (including the publication or distribution of statements), any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.
- 4. Upon the dissolution of this organization, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code or corresponding section of any future Federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the Federal Government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose."
