#### ORIGINAL ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

The undersigned acting as incorporator(s) of a corporation under Chapter 7-1.1 of the General Laws, 1956, as amended, adopt(s) the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation:

To engage in a cleaning supply distribution business and any other act or activity for which corporations may be organized under the Rhode Island Business Corporation Act, as the same may be amended from time to time.

The corporation shall have power: (See §7-1.1-4 of the General Laws, 1956, as amended.)

- (a) To have perpetual succession by its corporate name, mainsace about eck apartial control of the corporations and the corporations of the corporation of the corporation
  - (b) To sue and be sued, complain and defend, in its corporate name.
- (c) To have a corporate seal which may be altered at pleasure, and to use the same by causing it, or a facsimile thereof, to be impressed or affixed or in any other manner reproduced.
- (d) To purchase, take, receive, lease, or otherwise acquire, own, hold, improve, use and otherwise deal in and with, real or personal property, or any interest therein, wherever situated.
- (e) To sell, convey, mortgage, pledge, lease, exchange, transfer and otherwise dispose of all or any part of its property and assets.
  - (f) To lend money and to use its credit to assist its employees.
- (g) To purchase, take, receive, subscribe for, or otherwise acquire, own, hold, vote, use, employ, sell, mortgage, lend, pledge or otherwise dispose of, and otherwise use and deal in and with, shares or other interests in, or obligations of, other domestic or foreign corporations, associations, partnerships or individuals, or direct or indirect obligations of the United States or of any other government, state, territory, governmental district or municipality or of any instrumentality thereof.
- (b) To make contracts and guarantees and incur liabilities, borrow money at such rates of interest as the corporation may determine, issue its notes, bonds, and other obligations, and secure any of its obligations by mortgage or pledge of all or any of its property, franchises, and income.
- (i) To lend money for its corporate purposes, invest and reinvest its funds, and take and hold real and personal property as security for the payment of funds so loaned or invested.
- (j) To conduct its business, carry on its operations, and have offices and exercise the powers granted by this chapter, within or without this state.
  - (k) To elect or appoint officers and agents of the corporation, and define their duties and fix their compensation.
- (i) To make and alter by-laws, not inconsistent with its articles of incorporation or with the laws of this state, for the administration and regulation of the affairs of the corporation.
  - (m) To make donations for the public welfare or for charitable, scientific or educational purposes,
- (n) To transact any lawful business which the board of directors shall find will be in aid of governmental authority.
- (o) To pay pensions and establish pension plans, pension trusts, profit-sharing plans, stock option plans and other incentive plans for any or all of its directors, officers and employees.
- (p) To provide insurance for its benefit on the life of any of its directors, officers, or employees, or on the life of any stockholder for the purpose of acquiring at his death shares of its stock owned by such stockholder.
  - (q) To be a promoter, partner, member, associate, or manager of any partnership, enterprise or venture.
  - (r) To have and exercise all powers necessary or convenient to effect its purposes.

Shareholders shall have no preemptive rights to subscribe for, purchase, or otherwise acquire any shares of the capital stock of the corporation which the corporation proposes to issue, or any rights or options which the corporation proposes to grant for the purchase of shares of the corporation.

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## EXHIBIT A

## ORIGINAL ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

#### SHIPS WHEEL BRAND CORPORATION

SIXTH: For the regulation of the business and the conduct of the internal affairs of the corporation, it is provided as follows:

- l. The corporation may, from time to time, and in conformity with the provisions of the Rhode Island Business Corporation Act, as amended, distribute to its shareholders, directly or by the purchase of its own shares, a portion of its assets, in cash or property out of the unreserved and unrestricted capital surplus of the corporation.
- 2. Except for those actions excluded by the provisions of the Rhode Island Business Corporation Act, as amended, any action required or permitted to be taken at a meeting of shareholders may be taken without a meeting upon the written consent of less than all the shareholders entitled to vote thereon if the shareholders who so consent would be entitled to cast at least the minimum number of votes which would be required to take such action at a meeting at which all shareholders entitled to vote thereon were present. In the event of such written action, prompt notice of such action shall be given to all shareholders who would have been entitled to vote upon the action if such meeting were held.
- 3. The stock of the corporation is subject to transfer restrictions as noted in its Bylaws and copies thereof are on file at the registered office of the corporation. Certificates of stock of the corporation are transferable only upon compliance with the provisions of said transfer restrictions.

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
