ORIGINAL ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION (NON-BUSINESS CORPORATION)

Know all Men by these Presents, That we MARTIN LIFLAND, THOMAS W. PEARLMAN,
DAVID HASSENFELD, MALCOLM BROMBERG, DR. JOSEPH J. FISHBEIN, PAUL CHERNOV,
DR. JOSEPH KATZ, MILTON WINKLER, ISAIAH SEGAL, JOSEPH DUBIN, ALAN BRIER,

all of lawful age, hereby agree to and with each other:

FIRST. To associate ourselves together with the intention of forming a corporation under and by virtue of the powers conferred by Chapter 7-6 of the General Laws of Rhode Island.

SECOND. Said corporation shall be known by the name of

NEW ENGLAND ACADEMY OF TORAH, INC.

Third: Said corporation is constituted for the purpose of advancing secular, religious and rabbinical education at the secondary educational level and furthering by all proper and legitimate means the dissemination of traditional orthodox Hebrew and Jewish religious and moral values; building and maintaining schools and places of public worship; publishing and circulating literature; providing for the delivery and holding of lectures, exhibitions, public meetings, classes and conferences, receiving gifts, legacies and donations from any sources whatsoever, granting diplomas and degrees commensurate with its character and educational level, fund raising activities of all kinds; exercising all such power, authority and activities as may be reasonable or necessary to carry out the purposes and objects above specified, but the purpose and essence of this corporation, being purely religious, literary, charitable and philanthropic, it is expressly declared that this is a corporation not for gain or individual profit and that no dividend shall ever be declared or paid to any of its members, and that none of its property, real or personal, shall ever be used or expended except in carrying into effect the legitimate ends and aims of its being.

In addition to the foregoing, said corporation shall have the following powers and authority, viz:—(See §§ 7-6-7, 7-6-8 of the General Laws.)

To do any lawful act which is necessary or proper to accomplish the purposes of its incorporation. Without limiting or enlarging the effect of this general grant of authority, it is hereby specifically provided that every such corporation shall have power:

- (a) to have perpetual succession in its corporate name unless a period for its duration is limited in its articles of association or charter;
- (b) to sue and be sued in its corporate name;
- (c) to have and use a common seal and alter the same at pleasure;
- (d) to elect such officers and appoint such agents as its purposes require, and to fix their compensation and define their duties;
- (e) to make by-laws not inconsistent with the Constitution or laws of the United States or of this state, or with the corporation's charter or articles of association, determining the time and place of holding and the manner of calling and of conducting meetings of its members and directors, the manner of electing its officers and directors, the mode of voting by proxy, and the number, qualifications, powers, duties and term of office of its officers and directors, and containing any other provisions, whether of the same or of a different nature, for the management of the corporation's property and the regulation and government of its affairs;
- (f) to make contracts, incur liabilities and borrow money.

Said corporation shall be entitled to take, hold, transmit and convey real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding in all one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000); provided, however, that the foregoing limitation shall not apply to corporations organized for the purposes of fostering, encouraging and assisting the physical location, settlement or resettlement of industrial and manufacturing enterprises within the state, and to whose members no profit shall ensue. If any corporation subject to the foregoing limitation desires to take and hold property to an amount exceeding one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) either originally or by amendment, such privilege shall be granted only by the general assembly on petition therefor.
