FIRST. To associate ourselves together with the intention of forming a corporation
under and by virtue of the powers conferred by Chapter 7-6 of the General Laws of
Rhode Island.
SECOND. Said corporation shall be known by the name of
CITIZENS SCHOLARSHIP FOUNDATION OF BARRINGTON, INC.
THIRD. Said corporation is constituted for the purpose of Establishing a fund
for the granting of scholarships and other financial assistance to residents
of the Town of Barrington, who may be students and enrolled in any college or
accredited school and to grant from such fund scholarships or other financial
assistance to the aforesaid students, and to solicit and receive gifts and
grants of money and property, both real and personal, and invest, reinvest and
otherwise administer the same for the aforesaid purposes and to do anything
necessary or proper for the accomplishment of these purposes:
In addition to the foregoing, said corporation shall have the following powers and
authority, viz:—(See §§ 7-6-7, 7-6-8 of the General Laws.)
To do any lawful act which is necessary or proper to accomplish the purposes of its incorporation. Without limiting or enlarging the effect of this general grant of authority, it is hereby specifically provided that every such corporation shall have power:
(a) to have perpetual succession in its corporate name unless a period for its duration is limited in its articles of association or charter;
(b) to sue and be sued in its corporate name;(c) to have and use a common seal and elter the same at pleasure;
(d) to elect such officers and appoint such agents as its purposes require, and to fix their compensation and define their duties; (e) to make by-laws not inconsistent with the Constitution or laws of the United States or of this state, or with the
corporations charter or articles of association, determining the time and place of holding and the manner of calling and of conducting meetings of its members and directors, the manner of electing its officers and directors, the mode of voting by proxy, and the number, qualifications, powers, duties and term of office of its officers and directors, and containing any other provisions,

whether of the same or of a cureron parties, to the same or of a cureron parties, and borrow money.

Said corporation shall be entitled to take, hold, transmit and convey real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding in all one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000). But if such corporation desires to take and hold property to an amount exceeding one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) either originally or by amendment, such privilege shall be granted only by the general assembly on petition thereto.

amendment shall be given to each member by regular mail, postage prepaid at
least fifteen (15) days prior thereto.
