ORIGINAL ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION.

(NON-BUSINESS CORPORATION.)

Know all Men by these Presents, That we Gabriel D. Russo, William A. Watkinson and John P. Gallagher, Gennaro L. Perrotti and Peter P. Pascale.

all of lawful age, hereby agree to and with each other:

FIRST. To associate ourselves together with the intention of forming a corporation under and by virtue of the powers conferred by Article III of Chapter 116 of the General Laws of Rhode Island.

SECOND. Said corporation shall be known by the name of

-----Kiwanis Club of Newport, Inc.-----

THIRD. Said corporation is constituted for the purpose of
Giving primacy to the human and spiritual rather than to the material values of life,
Encouraging the daily living of the Golden Rule in all human relationships,
Promoting the adoption and the application of higher social, business, and professional standards,
Developing, by precept and example, a more intelligent, aggressive, and serviceable citizenship,
Providing, through this club, a practical means to form enduring friendships, to render altruistic service, and to build better communities,
Cooperating in creating and maintaining that sound public opinion and high idealism which make possible the increase of righteousness, justice, patriotism, and good will, and
Receiving and distributing gifts of property of all kinds, real and personal.

In addition to the foregoing, said corporation shall have the following powers and authority, viz:—(See § 75, Chapter 116 of the General Laws.)

To do any lawful act which is necessary or proper to accomplish the purposes of its incorporation. Without limiting or enlarging the effect of this general grant of authority, it is hereby specifically provided that every such corporation shall have power:

- (a) to have perpetual succession in its corporate name unless a period for its duration is limited in its articles of association or charter;
- (b) to sue and be sued in its corporate name;
- (c) to have and use a common seal and alter the same at pleasure;
- (d) to elect such officers and appoint such agents as its purposes require, and to fix their compensation and define their duties;
- (e) to make by-laws not inconsistent with the constitution or laws of the United States or of this state, or with the corporation's charter or articles of association, determining the time and place of holding and the manner of calling and of conducting meetings of its members and directors, the manner of electing its officers and directors, the mode of voting by proxy, and the number, qualifications, powers, duties and term of office of its officers and directors, and containing any other provisions, whether of the same or of a different nature, for the management of the corporation's property and the regulation and government of its affairs;
- (f) to make contracts, incur liabilities and borrow money.

Said corporation shall be entitled to take, hold, transmit and convey real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding in all \$150,000.00. But if such corporation desires to take and hold property to an amount exceeding \$150,000.00 either originally or by amendment, such privilege shall be granted only by the general assembly on petition thereto.
