(NON-BUSINESS CORPORATION.)

Know all Men by these Presents, That we George J. De Giorgis, Charles E. Warrender, Joseph D. Esposito, Collis O. Beck, Joseph A. Rhault

all of lawful age, hereby agree to and with each other:

FIRST. To associate ourselves together with the intention of forming a corporation under and by virtue of the powers conferred by Article III of Chapter 116 of the General Laws of Rhode Island.

SECOND. Said corporation shall be known by the name of Rhode Island Retail Bakers Association

THIRD. Said corporation is constituted for the purpose of bringing together all those Rhode Island retail bakers who are interested in obtaining a better understanding of the problems connected with the business of retail baking; also for the purpose of conducting a social organization of representatives of all retail bakers for their entertainment, enlightenment, and the discussion of their problems; and to vigilantly seek to prevent the infraction of any and all laws, ordinances, and regulations imposed on retail baking establishments; and to work co-operatively for the mutual benefit of all members in any and every way possible; and also to co-operate with all branches of authority, whether they be local, state, or federal, in the conservation of sugar, flour, and any other staples that are vital and necessary for the defense of our country.

In addition to the foregoing, said corporation shall have the following powers and authority, viz:—(See § 75, Chapter 116 of the General Laws.)

To do any lawful act which is necessary or proper to accomplish the purposes of its incorporation. Without limiting or enlarging the effect of this general grant of authority, it is hereby specifically provided that every such corporation shall have power:

(a) to have perpetual succession in its corporate name unless a period for its duration is limited in its articles of association or charter;

(b) to sue and be sued in its corporate name;

(c) to have and use a common seal and alter the same at pleasure;

(d) to elect such officers and appoint such agents as its purposes require, and to fix their compensation and define their duties;

(e) to make by-laws not inconsistent with the constitution or laws of the United States or of this state, or with the corporation's charter or articles of association, determining the time and place of holding and the manner of calling and of conducting meetings of its members and directors, the manner of electing its officers and directors, the mode of voting by proxy, and the number, qualifications, powers, duties and term of office of its officers and directors, and containing any other provisions, whether of the same or of a different nature, for the management of the corporation's property and the regulation and government of its affairs;

(f) to make contracts, incur liabilities and borrow money.

Said corporation shall be entitled to take, hold, transmit and convey real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding in all \$150,000.00. But if such corporation desires to take and hold property to an amount exceeding \$150,000.00 either originally or by amendment, such privilege shall be granted only by the general assembly on petition thereto.
