The GOVERNOR and COMPANY of the English Colony of Rhode-Island, and Providence Plantations, in New-England:

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting. 11

HEREAS fundry Persons, belonging to the Congregation, assembling for the public Worship of Almighty God, with the Christian Church, called Baptist, or Antipædobaptist, in the Town of Providence, being the oldest Christian Church in this Colony, and professing to believe that Water-Baptism ought to be administred by Immersion only, and that protessed

Believers in Jesus Christ, and no others, are proper Subjects of the same, have petitioned this Assembly to grant them a Charter of Incorporation, with the Privileges and Powers herein after-mentioned: NOW THERE-FORE KNOW YE, That we, the Governor and Company in General Assembly convened, do, for ourselves and our Successors, Enact, Grant, Ordain, Constitute, and Declare; and it is hereby Enacted, Granted, Constituted, and declared, That Paul Tew, John Brown, Nicholas Brown, John Jenckes, William Russell, Daniel Caboon, Aaron Mason, William Holroyd, Samuel Warner, Christopher Sheldon, Benjamin Stelle, Samuel Thurbur, jun. Benjamin Alger, Martin Thurber, Obadiab Sprague, William Wheaton, jun. Timothy Mason, Edward Thurber, Joseph Hewes, James Wheaton, jun. James Arnold, Nicholas Power, Daniel Tillinghast, Dexser Brown, Comfort Wheaton, Martin Seamans, James Wheaton, Simon Smith, William Corlis, Joseph Tillingball, Charles Easterbrooks, Timothy Sheldon, jun. Charles Smith, Sylvanus Jenckes, Edward Knowles, Amos Horton, Nathaniel Saunders, Olney Windsor, and Refus Hopkins, or such, or so many of them, as shall convene at the Baptist Meeting-House, in Providence, on the Second Monday in June next, on the Business of this Charter, & their Successors, shall be forever hereafter One Body Corporate & Politic, in Fact & Name, with perpetual Succession, to be known in the Law by the Name of The Charitable Baptist Society, in the Town of Providence, in the Colony of Rhode-Island, and Providence Plantations And the faid Charitable Society is hereby empowered to take, receive, and hold all, and any, voluntary Subscriptions, Contributions, Legacies, and Donations of any Sum, or Sums of Money, or of any real and personal Estate: Also to have, take, possess, purchase, acquire, or otherwise receive and hold, Lands, Tenements, Hereditaments, Goods, Chattels, or other Estates; of all which they shall, and may stand seized, notwithstanding any Misnomer of this Corporation, and by whatever Name, or however imperfectly, the same shall be described, in Donations, Legacies, Alfignments, and Grants; provided the true Intent and

Meaning of the Assigner or Benefactor be evident : Also the faid Charitable Society is hereby empowered to take, hold, and stand seized of, all Estates aforesaid, folely to and for the Ute and Benefit of the faid Baptift, or Antipædobaptist Church, and Congregation, and their Successors forever, and the same to use, occupy, and improve, toward the Support of Pastors, Relief of the P or, in schooling their Children, or otherwise, or any other religious Ules in faid Church and Congregation, according to the Will of the Donors, and to the Purposes, Trusts, and Uses, to which they shall be seized thereof, or the same shall be designed: Also to lease the real Estate, or the same to grant, demise, alien, or hold in Perpetuity, according to the Tenor of each particular Donation, or their Property therein; and to let Monies on Bonds, Mortgages, or other Securities: And shall and may be Persons capable in the Law, as a Body corporate, to sue, and be sued, to plead, and be impleaded, to answer, and be answered unto, to defend, and pursue to final Judgment and Execution thereon, in all Courts and Places, and before all proper Judges whatever, in all and fingular Suit, and Suits, Cautes, and Actions, of what Kind soever, in the sullest and amplest Manner, by, and in the Name of, their Treafurer, for the Time being.

AND FURTHERMORE, faid Body corporate, and their Successers forever hereaster, shall, and may, have a public Seal, which they may use for any Purpotes or Affairs as to them shall seem expedient: Also it shall be lawful for them the same Seal to break, after, and make anew, from Time to Time, at their Will and Plenture.

AND be it further Enacled, That whatever Monies, or other Estates, both real and personal, the said Charitable Society may become seized, or possessed of, shall be and remain a capital Stock or Fund, and only the Interest, yearly Profits, or income thereof, shall be applied and appropriated to the Use of the said Baptist, or Antipædabaptist, Church and Congregation.

POVIDED, nevertheless, and be it further Enasted, That all Donations, to the faid Charitable Society, by voluntary Subscription, Contribution, Legacy, or otherwife (excepting fuch as thall be differently appropriated by the Donors) shall make a capital Stock or Fund for the Support of the Paffor, or Paffors, of the Church aforefaid; and the yearly Interest or Income of the same shall be added, every Year successively, to the principal, which shall be thus augmented by Interest, and remain, Principal and Interest, unappropriated, until the yearly interest or Income of taid Fund, so raised, finail amount to One Hundred Pounds, lawful Money, per Annum: After which Time the faid Sum of One Hundred Pounds thall yearly be paid, by the faid Charitable Society, to the Paftor or Patfors, for the Time being, of faid Baptift, or Antipædobaptift, Church, & their Successors, forever: Provided, notwithstanding. That when, and as foon as, a capital Stock or Fund shall be, by this Means, railed, to produce One Hundred Pounds, lawful Money, per Annum, that then the Interest or yearly Income of all Donations made after-

ward to faid Charitable Society, the Us and Purpose of which shall not be particularly specified by the Donors, shall be appropriated as a Majority of the said Charitable Society shall order and determine at any re-

And in Case, at any Time hereafter, through Misapprehension, or mistaken Construction, of the Powers contained in this Charter, any Laws shall be enacted, or any Matters done & transacted, by this Corporation, contrary to the Tenor hereof, such Laws, Acts, and Doings, shall be in themselves null and void; but shall never be ar judged into an Avoid ince, Deseazance, or Forseiture of this Charter, but the fame shall remain entire to the said Corporation, in perpetual Succession, forever. And all their Acts conformable to its Powers, Tenor, true Intent, and Meaning, shall be, and remain of full Force and legal Validity.
