June Session 1828 A.D.

It is exected by the General Assembly as follows:

An act to incorporate certain persons by the name and style of the Westminster Congregational Society.

Section I Be it enacted by the General Assembly and by the Authority thereof it is enacted, That Nathan Hastings, Joseph Sweet, David Barton and their associates together wish such others as shall hereafter be elected by them, they and their successors, be and they are hereby created a lody corporate and positic with perpetual aucheration, by the neme of the Yestminster Congregational Society, in Providence for the purpose of supporting maintaining and promulgating the Christ-ism religion, and by that uses shall be able and capable in law to sur end be sued, to place and be impleaded, to defend end to be defended against in all countr and places and before oll proper judges and augistrates whomspover; to take, recoive and hold all montes and other property by voluntary ambacription, contribution densities or otherwise: siso all legacies and devices of real and personal estate, and also to have, beid, possess and acquire lands, tenements and heredituments, goode, chattels and property of every description, not execedrug to all the sum of \$75,000, and all and singular the entara and property aforesaid to lesse, grant, convey or dispose of in such manner as they judge expedient, at their will and pleasure; to have and use a common scal and the same to altar and renew at ploasure; and, at any of their meetings to enact and pass such rule, regulations and by-laws for the government of seld corporation and the management of affairs thereof, as they may does proper and necessary; provided, however, the same he not repugnant to this act of incorporation, the laws of this State or of the United States.

the " kind be in further enacted, That said Corporation shall and any held an annual meeting on the first Monday of June, in each and every year, and such other meetings at other times as they shall see cause, to be called and notified in such way and member as they shall prescribe, to transact their business; and that seven members of said corporation, of which the president, trequirer or secretary theroof shall always be one, shall be necessary to form a quorum.

Sec. 3 And be it further enacted, That said corporation, at their said annual meeting, shall elect out of their own body,

a president, tressurer and secretary and such other officers as they may see cause, who shall hold their respective offices for one year, and antil others shall be chosen in their stead, provided however, if said corporation shall at any time fail of holding any of their soid annual meetings, such failure shall not an any way impair or invalidate this act, but said corporation may elect their said officers at any other meeting thereof.

800. 4 And be it further enacted, That the said treasurer of said corporation shall, before he acts in and office, give bond, with sufficient surety or sureties, to said corporation to the satisfaction of the president thereof, for the faithful performance of the trusts and duties of said office, which bond shall be lodged in the secretary's office; that the breasurer shall keep a fair record of all the funds and money concerns of the corporation, and shall at every annual meeting, and oftener if required, render to said corporation a fair and distinct account of all their funds, and all montes received and paid out by him on their account.

Sec. 5 And be it further enacted, That Nathan Hastings be the first president, George Dank the first treasurer, and Henry Wescott the first secretary of said corporation, to continue in their respective effices until the first Monday of June A.D. 1829 and until other persons shall be elected by said corporation.

Sec. 6 And to it further enected, That Nathan Hantings, president of said comporation, shall cause a meeting of the members thereof, to be convened in the month of duly ensuing, at such time and place, and by giving notice thereof in such way and manner as he may does proper.

Sec. 7 And be it further enacted, That this set of incorporation shall forever be subject to all future acts of this General Assembly, either in Amendment or repeal thereof, or in may wise affecting the same.

- Sec. 7 And be it further enacted, That this act of incorporation shall forever be subject to all future acts of this General Assembly, either in Amendment or repeal thereof, or in any wise affecting the same.

(This Act was amended in 1965 to change the name of this Corporation to "Westminster Unitarian Church" to increase the amount which this Corporation may hold to "\$300,000", and to change the time of the annual meeting of the Corporation to the "month of January".)
