AN ACT

REINSTATING AND RESTORING FORFEITED
CORPORATE CHARTERS.

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. The forfeiture of the charters of those corporations enumerated in section 3 hereof, which are required by law to file annual reports with the secretary of state, shall be vacated. Said corporations shall be entitled to all the privileges, benefits, and powers, and shall be subject to all of the same duties and liabilities as though no forfeiture of their charters had taken place if, on or before September 30, 1979, said corporations shall (1) file any corporation tax returns as may be required; (2) pay all taxes which were due or should have been due to the state; (3) file with the secretary of state a certificate signed by the tax administrator that such tax returns have been filed and such taxes have been paid; and (4) also file all reports and pay all fees which may be required by the secretary of state.

SEC. 2. The forfeiture of the charters of those corporations enumerated in section 3 hereof, which are required by law to file biennial reports with the secretary of state, shall be vacated. Said corporations, subject to chapter 7-6, as amended, of the general laws, entitled "Nonbusiness corporations", notwithstanding any provision of the law to the contrary, shall file all reports and pay all fees which may be required by the secretary of state, and shall also pay to the general treasurer for the use of the state such sum as the attorney general shall decide should be paid by said corporations, as a compromise of the penalty or penalties for such failure to file such reports.

SEC. 3. The provisions of this act shall apply to the following corporations:

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
