WE, the undersigned Officers of

JEWISH COMMUNITY CEMETERY ASSOCIATION OF NEWPORT, INC.

a corporation duly incorporated under the laws of the State of Rhode Island,  
HEREBY CERTIFY, that at a legal meeting of said corporation, duly called for the purpose,  
and held in the City of Newport  
in said State, on the 26th day of March, A. D. 19 53.,  
the following amendment(s) to the Articles of Association was (or were) duly adopted by  
the affirmative vote of all of its members viz:--  
"Voted, That The Third article of the Articles of Association of  
this Corporation be amended so that it may be legally authorized  
to operate a Chapel, as follows: --

THIRD. Said corporation is constituted for the purpose of

- (1) Purchasing or otherwise acquiring, or constructing, laying out, fencing and maintaining one or more cemeteries at Middletown, Rhode Island, and elsewhere, and using or permitting the same to be used for the burial therein of human remains, in accordance with orthodox Jewish law and ritual.
- (2) Accepting and holding property given by will or otherwise transferred to it in trust for the care, preservation and beautification of its burial grounds, and of the stones, monuments, fences and other structures thereon, and administering and applying said trust property in accordance with the terms of the trusts, not to exceed the statutory provision of \$150,000.00.
- (3) Purchasing or otherwise acquiring land and constructing thereon a building as a Jewish funeral chapel, together with all such property, goods, wares, and merchandise as are incidental to and used therein, and foresaid use.
