 (b) to sue and be sued in its corporate name; (c) to have and use a common seal and after the same at pleasure; (d) to elect such officers and appoint such agents as its purposes require, and to fix their compensation and define their 				
duties; (e) to make by-laws not inconsistent with the constitution or laws of the United States or of this state, or with the corporation's charter or satisfies of association, determining the time and place of holding and the manner of calling and of conducting meetings of its members and directors, the manner of electing its officers and directors, the mode of voting by proxy, and the number, qualifications, powers, duties and term of office of its officers and directors, and containing any other provisions, whether of the same or of a different nature, for the management of the corporation's property and the regulation and government of its affairs;				
(f) to make contracts, incur liabilities and borrow money. Said corporation shall be entitled to take, hold, transmit and convey real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding in all \$150,000.00. But if such corporation desires to take and hold property to an amount exceeding \$150,000.00 either originally or by amendment, such privilege shall be granted only by the general assembly on petition thereto.
