FIRST. To associate ourselves together with the intention of forming a corporation
under and by virtue of the powers conferred by Article III of Chapter 116 of the General
Laws of Rhode Island.
SECOND. Said corporation shall be known by the name of

THIRD. Said corporation is constituted for the purpose of (a) promoting,
advertising, associating together and with the public at large in
furthering, fostering and promoting sport fishing of every type
and description; (b) engaging in the testing, investigating, and
use of equipment of all types and descriptions in said sport
fishing endeavors; (c) catching, mounting, disposing of and
dealing in catches of fish, marine life, etc., (d) doing all
other acts in furtherance of the purposes of this association.

In addition to the foregoing, said corporation shall have the following powers and
authority, viz:—(See § 75, Chapter 116 of the General Laws.) To do any lewful set which is necessary or proper to secomplish the purposes of its incorporation. Without limiting or
enlarging the effect of this general grant of authority, it is hereby specifically provided that every such corporation shall have power:
 (a) to have perpetual succession in its corporate name unless a period for its duration is limited in its articles of association or charter; (b) to sue and be sued in its corporate name;
(c) to have and use a common seal and alter the same at pleasure;(d) to elect such officers and appoint such agents as its purposes require, and to fix their compensation and define their
duties; (e) to make by-laws not inconsistent with the constitution or laws of the United States or of this state, or with the corporation's charter or articles of association, determining the time and place of holding and the manner of calling and of conducting meetings of its members and directors, the manner of electing its officers and directors, the mode of voting by proxy, and the number, qualifications, powers, duties and term of office of its officers and directors, and containing any other provisions, whether of the same or of a different nature, for the management of the corporation's property and the regulation and government
of its affairs; (1) to make contracts, incur liabilities and borrow money. Said corporation shall be entitled to take, hold, transmit and convey real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding in all \$150,000.00. But if such corporation desires to take and hold property to an amount exceeding \$150,000.00 either originally or by amendment, such privilege shall be granted only by the general assembly on petition thereto. (Over)

FOURTH. Said corporation shall be located in East Greenwich, Rhode Island. (City or Town) (Further provisions not inconsistent with law) FIFTH Membership in the organization shall be open to all members acceptable to a majority of the incorporators, and _____ thereafter acceptable to 2/3rds of the membership committee; of the association, which said applicants for membership shall agree to be bound by and abide by the by-laws of the association.
