## ORIGINAL ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION (NON-BUSINESS CORPORATION)

Know all Men by these Presents. That we Francis B. Brown,
Ronald Glantz, Edward Aptt, Linda Lee Salerno and
Joseph F. Rodgers, Jr.
all of lawful age, hereby agree to and with each other:
FIRST. To associate ourselves together with the intention of forming a corporation
under and by virtue of the powers conferred by Chapter 7-6 of the General Laws of Rhode Island.
SECOND. Said corporation shall be known by the name of Professional  Law Enforcement Institute
THIRD. Said corporation is constituted for the purpose of the professional
activities and to do all other things relating thereto and pertaining.
to projects designed to develop or demonstrate effective methods for
increasing the security of person and property; controlling the
incidence of lawlessness and promoting respect for law including but
not limited to (A) improving the quality of law enforcement personnel
and personnel employed or preparing for employment in programs for the
prevention or control of crime (B) improving the capabilities, techniques
and practices of law enforcement agencies and personnel, the administration
In addition to the foregoing, said corporation shall have the following powers and authority, viz:—(See §§ 7-6-7, 7-6-8 of the General Laws.)
To do any lawful act which is necessary or proper to accomplish the purposes of its incorporation. Without limiting or enlarging the effect of this general grant of authority, it is hereby specifically provided that every such corporation shall have
power:  (a) to have perpetual succession in its corporate name unless a period for its duration is limited in its articles of association or charter:
(b) to sue and be sued in its corporate name; (c) to have and use a common seal and after the same at pleasure;

(d) to elect such officers and appoint such agents as its purposes require, and to fix their compensation and define their

duties;

(e) to make by-laws not inconsistent with the Constitution or laws of the United States or of this state, or with the corporation's charter or articles of association, determining the time and place of holding and the manner of calling and of conducting meetings of its members and directors, the mode of voting by proxy, and the number, qualifications, powers, duties and term of office of its officers and directors, and containing any other provisions, whether of the same or of a different nature, for the management of the corporation's property and the regulation and government of its affairs; (f) to make contracts, incur liabilities and borrow money.

Said corporation shall be entitled to take, hold, transmit and convey real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding in all one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000); provided, however, that the foregoing limitation shall not apply to corporations organized for the purposes of lostering, encouraging and assisting the physical location, actilement or resettlement of industrial and manufacturing enterprises within the state, and to whose members no profit shall course. If any corporation subject to the foregoing limitation desires to take and hold property to an amount exceeding one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) either originally or by amendment, such privilege shall be granted only by the general assembly on petition thereto

FOURTH. Said corporation shall be located in Providence, Rhode Island.

In reply to your letter of October 9, please be advised it is my opinion that Professional Law Enforcement Institute, Articles of Association for which were submitted with your letter, is not an institution as contemplated by the provisions of Section 16-40-1 of the General Laws of Rhode Island, 1956, as Amended.

This Institute appears to be an in-service training program for law enforcement agencies and personnel and not an "...academy, college, university, or other institution of secondary or higher education... to which the statute refers. Therefore, I believe that the approval of these Articles of Association by the State Board of Education is not required.
